- All Wellington County south of Guelph
- Halton west of Guelph Line from Hwy 34 to Campbellville Rd
- City of Hamilton north of Safari Road and west of Hwy 6.

June 29, 2020

On behalf of Ontario's four feather boards, the Feather Board Command Centre is announcing that the consolidated **ILT Biosecurity Advisory Area consisting of described contiguous portions of Wellington County south, west Halton and north west Hamilton is now lifted.** [MAP](#)

This consolidated Biosecurity Advisory Area contained 4 ILT infected small chicken flocks. When it created on June 1, it enveloped 3 previous Biosecurity Advisory Areas created May 1, May 7 and May 14 in Wellington, Halton and Hamilton respectively.

Disease control measures have been completed and normal described biosecurity levels can now be restored.
